They also seem to be finding it just as difficult as we do, to bridge the generation gap as their clubs, like ours, are ageing. But what was also very evident is that, like us, they are very committed to what they do and they enjoy doing what they do.

I cannot leave the subject of Hamburg without expressing my sincere appreciation for the support Chris and I received from John and Glenys Sanders, Robert and Diana Mackie, and Ralph and Jean Smith from my own club, but also my thanks go to those from all around the District who travelled to Hamburg. If it was your first International Convention please do let others know the fun we had. I am already saving for Toronto!

Handover

My thanks to everyone who came along to Handover on Saturday, 20th July. I was a little disappointed in the overall numbers, especially as we had listened to the membership who had commented that a Friday night function was not the best night to hold Handover, particularly for those who worked. KEITH ROYLE YOUTH TROPHY 2013

At the District Handover at Mold on 20th July the above Trophy was awarded to Stone Lions Club. This is the Youth Trophy that rewards participation in Lions Youth Projects only and runs throughout the Lionistic Year.

The Youth Team pool their information relative to their project area and points are allotted to arrive at the winning Club. Hence Clubs do not need to apply to enter this competition. Stone Lions Club gained 48 points. In second place was Gnosall with 25 points and in joint 3rd place were Cannock, Stoke on Trent and Tamworth Lions Clubs – each with 20 points.

Other Lions Clubs achieving points from their involvement were Buckley and Mold (14), Cheadle (10), Ellesmere Port(5), Helsby and Frodsham(6), Ironbridge(6), Knutsford(5), Llandudno(5), Beaumaris Menai Aethwy(5), Middlemarches(5), Stockton Heath(5), Uttoxeter(10), Vale of Llangollen(5), Wallasey(7), West Kirby(5), Whitchurch(9) and Wilmslow(15).

Most of these Clubs' points were gained from involvement in the Peace Poster and YLIS. This is only 22 Clubs out of 60 in the District. It would be great to see more Clubs Taking part in Lions Projects.

Cannock Lions Club took a leaf out of the I.P.I.P Wayne Madden's Literacy Theme, and has provided Books for Longford Primary School's new library. The grand opening was attended by P.P.Lion Doug Smith and welfare chair Lion Robin Roberts.

The School had funded staff to check all stock and discarded out of date or poor

condition books, supplied a computer based check in/out system and provide new seating areas. The library now had a diminished supply of books and their long term plan was to provide more books but due to lack of funds they could not do it all at once. Cannock Lions Club stepped in and has provided almost 100 books.

Not content with that, the club then purchased a Guider Reader set for Bridgetown Primary School. These are particularly suitable for supporting boys in reading, writing and numeracy, and record the impact on students, greatly improving standards within



Cannock Lions are very proud to lead the way in Literacy and wished to encourage other clubs in the District to follow suit as the Literacy Theme has been extended to a 10 year period due to the success around the world.

There were arena events running all day and plenty of places to get a snack or a drink —much needed in the heat. Commercial and charity stalls gave an opportunity to shop or win a prize while local groups offered information and advice on a range of topics. Community involvement was a key aspect of the day with Cubs selling programmes and Air Cadets acting as marshals as well as raising

money for their organisations.

Radio Shropshire dropped in during the morning as the event was one of the clues in their Sunday morning treasure hunt, when the aerial went up it created another interesting vehicle in the display.

Lion President Kevin Hopley said "The aim of the event is always to create a fun day out for the community while giving an opportunity to raise some much needed funds for local charities, it is estimated around £6,000 was raised in total which will be of great benefit to many worthwhile causes."
