Lions make donation to war zone 'first responders'

Ironbridge Lions have donated £250 to TROOP AID, a charity that supports injured troops, after meeting with one of its founders.

TROOP AID was founded in 2006 by three former servicemen following an emotional visit to the Alexandra Wing at Birmingham's Selly Oak Hospital, the home of Defence Medical Welfare Services who take care of Armed Forces Personnel returning injured from war zones.

Al Sutton, one of the founders of TROOP AID, visited Ironbridge Lions to explain how his charity differed from its much larger and better known counterpart, Help for Heroes.

Announcing the club's decision to make a donation Lion President June Softley said: "TROOP AID is effectively a 'first responder', providing small essential items to troops the minute they are carried off the battlefield. After identifying the need for these items to be delivered as a matter of urgency to ensure the comfort and modesty of injured servicemen and women, the charity went on to design a 'grabbag' in which to transport them.

"Each grab-bag contains a t-shirt, shorts, trainers and underwear, washing, shaving and tooth-cleaning kit, towel, pen and paper and a mobile phone with £10 prepaid credit - all so important for soldiers who have been carried off the field, had their clothes cut-off to treat their injuries and then been put straight onto an aircraft, just as they are, to be flown to the UK and taken to hospital.

"Prior to Al Sutton coming to talk to us none of us had ever really considered what happens at the point of retrieval from a war zone, so we are delighted that we have been able to make a donation that will pay for ten grab-bags."

Tamworth Lions Donate Funds To Tamworth Talking Newspaper

Tamworth Lions collect used spectacles from opticians and charity shops in and around Tamworth.

The club has now collected over 46,000 pairs, and they are regularly forwarded to Chichester Lions Club, who sort the spectacles, and send on the re-usable spectacles for use in third world countries.

Some spectacles, if damaged or unusable, are recycled for their precious metals content, so that clubs who participate in the recycling scheme can periodically apply for funds for sight related projects in their area.

Tamworth Lions were recently successful in obtaining £500.00 from Chichester Lions.

As Tamworth Lions played a major part in the formation of Tamworth's Talking Newspaper, the organisation has been given funding and support by Lions over the last 30 + years, and the latest donation from the club is for a very worthy cause, as Tamworth Talking Newspaper take the Tamworth Herald, and read the weekly newspaper's contents onto USB sticks, and send them to local people who are blind or partially sighted, for them to play on equipment provided by The Talking Newspaper.

DG Statement to Convention – Re-Zoning as at 1 July 2014

I think it proper to remind Convention how we came to have only 9 Zones in District BS, notwithstanding that we have a Zone numbered Zone 10. Through the lack of a suitable Lion willing to serve as a Zone Chair for Zone 5 the DG of the day had to make a decision and had the courage to do just that – make a decision. Unfortunately, the hoped for emergence of a suitable and willing ZC candidate that would allow the reinstatement of Zone 5 has not materialised.

I have decided that the situation should not be allowed to drift on as it is any longer and another decision about the configuration of the Zones in District 105BS is now needed.

Constitutionally, the DG, and the DG alone, makes the decision as to the configuration of the Zones and advises Convention what that decision is. The decision becomes effective at the beginning of the next Lionistic year.

However, I did not think this satisfactory and decided that consultation was essential. Therefore, I discussed my proposals with your DGT, and the Zone Chairs and their comments were taken into consideration before the slightly revised plan was passed to the Planning Team for consideration. The Planning Team recommended a minor change that I accepted and this second revised plan was again put to the DGT and Zone Chairs for final comment and for distribution to clubs through the medium of your Zone meetings. Clubs were invited to comment and were reminded that constitutionally the decision about the configuration of Zones rested solely with the DG; indeed constitutionally there is no requirement for the DG to invite comment from the clubs at all and there is no scope for debate. Also, constitutionally, I am limited to how many clubs I may have in any one Zone; and that limit is 8.

I thank everyone who has taken the time and effort to consider my proposals and to respond in such positive spirit. In reaching my final decision I have considered all the input from all parties and I have complied with and applied the constitution as it stands today. I felt it fundamentally wrong to act contrary to the Constitution with the intent to change the Constitution retrospectively in support of my decision – I considered such action a very dangerous precedent.

Further, I have tried to maintain or create zones that are readily positioned to be able to support each other in the wider projects that is one of the principle reasons for us to have Zones. I have resisted the suggestion of creating zones in excess of 8 clubs on the basis that have zones of 170 Lions whilst others have only 75 is an imbalance that would only develop larger problems in the longer term. Keeping a more even spread of Lions throughout the Zones, I believe will generate the opportunity for cooperation between clubs, but also be a catalyst to trying to raise numbers within a zone.

Therefore, the following configuration of clubs within zones, the number of clubs within a zone and the number of lions (as at 1 March 2014) that would make up a zone from 1 July 2014 will be:
