# Macclesfield and District Lions Club 27<sup>th</sup> Annual Charity Swimarathon

Macclesfield and District Lions Club organised their 27<sup>th</sup> Swimarathon on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> November 2013 at the Leisure Centre, Macclesfield, at which many local organisations including the Scouts, local schoolchildren with ages ranging from eight to eighteen, and adults with ages from twenty one to nearly eighty years old. There were twenty nine teams taking part, from amateurs to the really professional swimmers

Over its twenty seven year history the event has raised well over £125,000 (that's an eighth of a million pounds folks), for BBC Children in Need, Riding for the disabled and Lions Charities. Over £4,500 has already been promised this year so far and the total is expected to be well in excess of this figure.

The event is organised by Past District Governor Arthur Clenton, ably assisted by Macclesfield members and their wives and ladies

#### Sam's Charity Concert raises £700 for head injury charity

An annual charity concert staged at Wellington Methodist Church has raised £700 for the Shropshire branch of Headway, the charity that works to improve life after brain injury.

The concert, staged on Saturday evening by Ironbridge and Severn Gorge Lions, has been held each December since 2008 when it was initiated by Sam Monk, a former member of the club who died earlier this year.

Known this year as 'Sam's Charity Concert' in memory of its creator, the event was attended by a packed audience who were entertained by the award winning Gallery Singers, Telford and District Light Operatic Players (TADLOP), Temponilla and local mezzo soprano singer Helen May.



Mince pies and coffee were served in the interval by members of Ironbridge Lions and at the end of the evening Lion President June Softley presented a cheque to Alex Hiam from Headway Shropshire. "Headway does fantastic work in the county," said Mrs. Softley, "and Ironbridge Lions are delighted to have raised £700 through Sam's Charity Concert to help them continue to provide support to people over 18 years of age with an acquired brain injury, along with their families and their carers.

"We are also delighted that Sam's widow Sheila could be with us for the event. The annual fundraiser concert was Sam's 'baby' and its success this year was a fitting tribute to his many years of hard work to help others."

At the District finals held at the Mercure Hotel in Chester, Beatrice's Poster, was judged the outright winner by all three judges and was forwarded to the Multi District Finals in Birmingham. Unfortunately Beatrice's work, this time, was unsuccessful as the winner announced on December 11<sup>th</sup> was from District SE.

The theme of the competition this year was "OUR WORLD - OUR FUTURE". The poster Beatrice produced was outstanding in it's originality, simplicity and workmanship. Comments from the professional artist judges, included :- "Clear and simple and so original", "Very cleverly executed", and "Clear, concise, and beautifully drawn".

As part of the competition Beatrice also had to make a Quote on her poster, based on the theme and her actual artwork. She wrote "**To live for others, not ourselves will bring peace to our future**". Beatrice added that the idea for her Poster was based around the thought that "In the same way that flowers need water to bloom, the countries in the world need peace and unity to ensure the safety of our future. "A wonderful, thought provoking quote from a gifted and caring young lady, and one that those in power positions in the world could perhaps take on board.

Her Head Teacher, Mr Tim Long added that the school was thrilled at Beatrice's success adding his own comment, "Beatrice has produced a creative and original take on the theme "OUR WORLD - OUR FUTURE". She has beautifully combined the ideas of love, unity and nurture to symbolise how an ideal world might be. "

Beatrice, along with her parents Mr and Mrs Philip Lofthouse, together a representative of her school, have all been invited to the Lions District 105BS Convention at the White House Hotel in Telford on 16<sup>th</sup> March for lunch and the presentation of prizes to both her and her school, where her poster will be on display for all delegates to see and admire.

#### Laura Regains Her Independence (Thanks largely to Vale Royal Lions)

Around 5 years ago local teenager Laura Hunt was diagnosed with spastic paraparesis, resulting in her reliance on other people to push her around in the heavy wheelchair supplied by statutory services. What she longed for was a lightweight manual wheelchair so that she could propel herself around and regain some independence.

Newlife Foundation, a leading children's disability charity, launched an appeal to raise £2,801 for the purchase of this wheelchair to transform Laura's life. Vale Royal Lions quickly recognized this deserving case and, after just over £800 had been donated by local concerns, committed to provide the total balance of £1,928.

Laura formally received the new lightweight wheelchair at a presentation at her school, Hebden Green in Winsford, Cheshire on December 9<sup>th</sup> 2013. Laura is shown together with, left to right, Lion Charles Cahill, Immediate Past President, Lion Peter Allsopp, head teacher Alison Ashley and, crouching next to Laura, Weaver Vale MP Graham Evans.

Laura's mum Dawn added that the new wheelchair will boost her confidence and her ability to socialize, and she will not rely on others for her mobility.
