BEV's PR Bit

First of all, something that was mentioned in Cabinet about insurance. Last year we had a small number of insurance claims. The procedure to be followed in the event of a claim is - **1**. Do not admit liability, **2**. Let D.O. Lion Allan Gardener know as soon as possible, **3**.Try to get witness statements, **4**.Record full details of the incident, **5**.Do not enter into any correspondence, **6**. Take photograph evidence if possible. We are now self-insured regarding money and regalia. Losses should be reported immediately to MD insurance broker and a claim form can be obtained by accessing the web site. The broker will assist liability as to settlement by MD Insurance.
