# DG message for February

This month, I thought it might be helpful to explain something which, for most Lions, is a bit of a mystery...but something which impacts all of us as Lions...The Council of Governors.

I must confess that until a few years ago I hadn't even heard of this "august" group, and people who did know about it seemed to speak in hushed terms...almost reverently! Well, let me tell you...members of the Council are just *members*, like the rest of us, and there's no need to speak in such tones... They are simply Lions trying to do their best for the organization when they meet on a quarterly basis.



At the latest session at the end of January I spent more than 48 hours locked up in a crowded meeting room at an hotel in Solihull, debating and reviewing a wide range of Lions topics. Apart from other governors the meeting was attended by the council secretary and the council treasurer, Andy Pemberton and Philip Goodier respectively, and chaired by Simon Moss, a former Governor in "M". Their job was to provide information and guidance to the Council members – but all decisions were made by the Governors, representing the 13 Districts in the UK and Ireland. I think if you speak to any of my fellow Governors, they'll all feel as I do that they are not *special*, but merely there to represent the views of the clubs in their Districts and, hopefully, to look after the long term interests of Lions as a whole.

This latter part means that the Governors have to try to think of the "bigger picture" and not be too parochial; and to ensure that decisions are made which are fair to the majority of Lions in this country. I can tell you that during this latest meeting there was often heated debate but that, in the end we reached conclusions on a number of important topics. Apart from questioning or accepting reports on various projects from MD officers, the Council spent a great deal of time reviewing the proposals for redistricting and ways to make the organisation more efficient and cost effective.

As a result, a number of resolutions were approved for consultation with clubs – notifications on the resulting resolutions will be issued very shortly. Eventually, these resolutions, possibly with amendments from clubs, will be debated at the MD Convention in May.

I will provide a more detailed update at our Cabinet meeting in Chester on February 7<sup>th</sup> – if you'd like to know more please join us there !

### TAMWORTH LIONS REACH 56,000!


Tamworth Lions have reached another milestone in their drive to collect and recycle spectacles.

The 84-year-old will travel to Buckingham Palace next year to receive his award from HM Queen Elizabeth.

A spokesman for the New Year's Honours said: "He was founder member of the Uttoxeter Lion's club in 1975 and is now the only charter member remaining.

"In 1998 he was elected chairman of the Millennium Committee where he was responsible for raising £80,000 for the improvement and extension of the Denstone Village Hall by organising local event's and applying for local grants.

# Three ways to support one target



One of our centenary targets is to raise £10,000 to fund the training of a hearing dog to be allocated to someone in our district. Such dogs make an immense difference to the life of someone with a hearing impair-



ment; bringing independence, companionship and confidence. The dog gives practical support 24 hours a day, alerting them to sounds they can't hear. Sounds we take for granted like the doorbell, the phone, alarm clock and even danger signals like the fire alarm. All clubs are asked to consider supporting this target.

Clubs can do this by simply making a donation – send it to the District Treasurer made payable to Lions District

**2**. Run a fund raising event specifically for this cause – promotional material is available and we may even be able to find someone who already has a dog to come along. Let me know if you want any help to make contact with the local Hearing Dogs Community Officer.



**3**. Collect used postage stamps and foreign coins. Stamps should have a border around them. Coins of any currency are accepted. If you just have a few a collecting box for each of these will be on the centenary display table at convention, if you want to do more I will have a supply of collecting boxes also on the stall.



Remember to record this and any other work towards centenary targets as part of your club's activities report. It is very simple;-

Go to MyLCI then to MY Club-Select Service Activity-Select Add activity-Select signature project – then a drop down menu will list all the MD targets-Select from the list and enter details then save.

### Santa takes well-earned rest after successful Christmas in Telford

One of Telford's best known and loved annual visitors is taking a well-earned rest after a busy festive season.

As well as visiting local children on Christmas Eve, Santa assisted the members of Ironbridge and Severn Gorge Lions throughout the month of December as they fundraised to help local causes and needy families.

Travelling with them through many miles of Telford's residential streets in his sleigh and visiting all the major supermarkets in the area, Santa helped Ironbridge Lions to raise more than £4500 in the run-up to Christmas.

In an age when local clubs and charity groups are struggling to keep going due to diminishing member numbers, Ironbridge Lions Club yet again accomplished an enviable list of achievements over the Christmas period including the collection of food items to prepare 102 hampers that were later distributed to local families by social services and other agencies.

Established in 1979, the club may have fewer and older members than it used to, but when it comes to fundraising for the people in the South Telford area, neither its efforts nor its success has diminished.

As well as its travels with Santa during December, the club, which currently has just 17 members, also helped out at both Ironbridge and Madeley Christmas lights switch-on and The Abraham Darby Academy fundraiser carols concert on the Iron Bridge on Christmas Eve. On January 3<sup>rd</sup> the club took 25 children plus carers to see Snow White and the Seven Dwarves at Oakengates Theatre, presenting each child with a goodie bag before they left.

President Mavis Derham said: "Although Club members all work really hard throughout the Christmas period it has to be said that we couldn't achieve what we do without the help and support of others. The Club has a number of 'Friends' it can call on for help during busy fundraising times, people who cannot commit to being full members but who are happy to help out when they can. We also get a lot of help from Telford Volunteer Police Cadets.

"In addition to our Friends we are also grateful to the local media who publish the dates and routes of our rounds with Santa and his sleigh in advance of our coming. But our biggest thanks have to go to the people of South Telford who year on year await our arrival and come out to meet us with contributions of money and food. This year in particular we were told by many that they had written the dates in their diaries so that they could make sure they didn't miss us. It's fantastic and we thank them all."
