Wrexham Maelor Lions Club

Wrexham Maelor Lions have been supplying Toiletry Packs to all the admittance wards of the Maelor Hospital Wrexham since 2012.

The wards covered are Mason, ENT, A & E and Lister to which a total of 2,500 packs have been issued at a cost of £3,200.

The aim is to supply toiletry items to the patients who are admitted into hospital in an emergency, giving them facilities to wash etc until they are able to make other arrangements.

This has project has proved very successful, a great benefit to the patients, and helpful to the staffs, which the members of Wrexham Maelor Lions hope to continue.

More good news

Here is a list of what we, as a Multiple District, aim to achieve by the end of 2017. Those highlighted in yellow have already been achieved – with spectacle recycling and measles vaccinations totals fast approaching their target figures.

- Plant 100,000 trees and 100,000 bulbs
- Recycle 1,000,000 pairs of spectacles, 10,000 hearing aids and 1,000,000 batteries
- Fund 100,000 measles vaccinations
- Run sessions for 100,000 prostate screenings and 100,000 diabetes screenings
- Make 100,000 befriending calls to the elderly and donate 100,000 pints of blood
- Walk, swim or run for a good cause
- Feed 100,000 hungry people
- Use LEHP to refer 100,000 for sight tests
- Encourage young people to give 100,000 hours of service via YLIS
- Clear 100 miles of paths
- Sponsor training for 14 hearing dogs (2 in Ireland, 1 each in other districts)

prostate cancer
screening clinic and

the new Llandudno Lifeboat station. Lion Stuart said on the day "I am so please with how the day went. There were 10 Lions and fiends taking part to raise money. I am grateful to the team and would like to also thank members of Happy Faces who joined our party and raised money for us and their charity. The sponsor money is now coming in and we expect to have raised £2,000. So on behalf of those who took part thanks you to everyone who have given so generously". Lion Stuart also thanked the management and staff at Zip World for a fantastic facility.

The Lions Club of Llandudno will be running a prostate cancer screening clinic on 24th April 2017 at the Trinity Centre, Llandudno. It is a free of charge clinic for males in the at risk age of 45 to 70 and consists of a very simple blood test. To run the clinic and cover the costs of the blood tests the Club needs to raise around £3,000. The Club is getting ever closer to this target but are still looking for support and donation.



Lion Stuart said "statistics show that from such test of 200 men, 10 per

cent will show a warning and need a referral to a GP. From those referrals half will indicate a positive of prostate cancer. By getting this early warning and treatment we can save the lives of these men."

Finding Lions on Cannock Chase

Rugeley & District Lions Club recently teamed up with Staffordshire Search and Rescue Team to help raise funds and awareness of the two organisations.

With sightings of various wild animals reported on nearby Cannock Chase over recent years it was decided that we should hold a 'Lion Hunt'.

The idea was that we would take an area of Cannock Chase and divide it into 1000 squares on a map, each square being numbered.

With the assistance of SSART we would then arrange for members of Rugeley Lions to go out and hide in 4 different areas of the Chase. SSART, who were on a Training Day, would then set off to discover them as quickly as possible.

As the Lions were found, the exact spot was recorded by the GPS equipment which was then compared to the number of the square on the map. This determined the winners of the raffle tickets with the first found determining fourth prize, the second third prize and so on.

The search started at midday and all Lions were returned safe and sound to base in time for winners to be announced by 4.00pm.

As well as the hunt, stalls were also set out and SSART provided various vehicles which were explained to

interested parties.

Recently the Search Team had approached us to see if we would assist them in purchasing some communications equipment. With a recent Duck Race which they had assisted us and the Lion Hunt we were able to present them with a cheque for £1175,
