DG Message for May Newsletter

Next week will herald one of the most momentous weeks in the history of our organisation. Delegates at our MD Convention in Eastbourne will decide whether to approve – or reject – resolutions which would change the way the organisation is run, in an effort to reduce costs.

During the past several months I have explained, in the Newsletter, at Cabinet, zone and club meetings, of the need to make our organisation more cost effective for the existing membership and for potential new members.

The background to this situation is that while membership has declined from more than 20,000 ten years ago to today's level of 15,000, little has been done to reduce our costs.



In the past 12 months the need has been made even more urgent by Ireland's desire to leave the MD which would reduce the membership "income" from dues by a substantial amount. We now face two choices: either raise MD dues or cut costs.

Each District within the MD has had extensive communication with its members. However, District EA raised an official dispute with the Council of Governors, covering various matters. Conciliators were appointed and they decided that the Council had followed the constitutional process correctly.

Part of the dispute hinged on the consultation period and potential implementation date for redistricting. The conciliators decided that an emergency resolution must be put by the Council to convention delegates, instructing next year's council to carry out further consultation, delaying redistricting from 2018 to 2019.

At Convention, a card vote will be used for delegates to either accept or reject the emergency resolution. If it is rejected the original redistricting resolutions (reducing the number of Districts to either eight or seven) will be voted on by secret ballot. My own view has not wavered since we began the cost review ...we should reduce the number of districts to *seven* to increase our savings.

It is, of course, up to club delegates to decide which way to vote – personally, I hope the emergency resolution will be rejected as I see no advantage in delaying the redistricting. All it does is further delay the inevitable ... and savings opportunities will be lost.

If any club delegate, potentially for or against the emergency resolution, or indeed any of the other resolutions, wishes to discuss the issues with me before Convention please do not hesitate to get in touch.

Bev's PR Bit

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

A good time was had by all! There was even time for a pass the parcel game and the hot buffet was followed by jelly and ice cream! (Well it was a birthday party—that's what you do!)


The club meet at the Holland's at 8pm on the first Tuesday of the month, and are actively seeking new members.
