

MARTIN TOMLINSON

Local Winsford man Martin Tomlinson, a father of two, suffers with Ehlers-danlos syndrome, a condition which dislocates his neck. His condition began with severe headaches in 2003 and, over 14 years, got progressively worse. Without surgery he could have ended up with paralysis.

Vale Royal Lions have been serving the local community for over 42 years, and health is one of their main focus areas. When they read of Martin Tomlinson's story in the Guardian earlier this year, they immediately donated £1,000 to his fund. They also pledged that the proceeds from their annual Bowls Challenge Competition, held during September, would also be for the benefit of Martin.



On April 24th this year Martin had an operation which ultimately screwed his skull and top two vertebrae together with titanium rods. It was performed in Barcelona by the only surgeon in Europe who could accomplish it. Martin is now at home and, with physiotherapy treatment, continues to improve; he can now enjoy life more with his wife Gemma and two children. His treatment and after-care was estimated at a cost of £60,000 and, via his YouCaring.com website, he has now raised over £36,000.

The Lions generated over £600 at their Bowls event and all members agreed that this should be increased to £1,000. The cheque was donated recently to Martin personally by Lion Myra Sales, at Martin's home in Winsford, as shown below.

treated to an evening of dance, music and colour with a delicious Indian buffet during the interval.


The event was started by the Griffin Dancers, from Cardinal Griffin Secondary School, whose individual
