
DG Teresa

ZONE D - BLOOD BIKE PROJECT

On Saturday 28th April, thanks to the cooperation and support of Morrison's, New Brighton, the latest fund-raising event – a bucket collection – between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., occurred.

We were blessed with very good late spring weather which obviously helped, as on a cold, wet day New Brighton certainly has less appeal, to visitors.

Four of the Zone D clubs combined, i.e. Birkenhead, Chester, Wallasey and West Kirby, supported, for most of the day, by members of the Cheshire and Merseyside Blood Bikes and a couple of Birkenhead based Disney characters, managed with the exceptional generosity of the store customers to raise \pounds 881.20, which thanks to West Kirby being able to claim gift aid will swell to more than £1050.

When members of Wallasey Lions paid in this money, into their charity account in Barclays Bank, Liscard, the member of staff asked for details of the Blood Bikes (she was totally unaware of their activities and their contribution to saving the NHS £200,000 per year) she requested additional details, including their charity number, so she could refer our deposit for possible match funding. If this appeal proves successful, the day will have raised over £ 1900, a significant contribution towards being able to purchase a new motorcycle for the organisation.

On a very sad note, it was reported over the May Bank Holiday a 40 year-old Blood Bike volunteer, Russell Corwen, was tragically killed in Lancaster, whilst delivering blood, a terrible reminder of the dangers the volunteers place themselves in, in their desire to help their communities.

Morrison's have already offered Zone D a further opportunity, towards the end of the year, for another bucket collection.

The sell out crowd was gripped in suspense, despite a few amusing moments in true am-dram tradition, and large portions of Pie, chips and peas before the final act.


