LIONS ANNUAL BEACH PARTY

The annual North Staffordshire Lions Clubs Beach Party took place on Tuesday 12th March, when 725 children with special needs, from 19 schools, battled through gales, torrential rain and floods to arrive at WaterWorld, Festival Park, ready for a day of fun in the pool.

The event, now in its 20th year, started when the Lions Clubs of North Staffordshire Cheadle, Gnosall and Newport, Leek and Biddulph, Newcastle under Lyme, Stone, Stoke on Trent and Uttoxeter - held the first of what was to become an annual event. Each club made a financial contribution and invited local schools catering for children with special needs to come along to enjoy a fun-filled experience. The day proved so

popular with the children, teachers and Lions themselves, that it was decided to make it an annual event.



A team of Lions arrived on the Monday evening to decorate the pool area with balloons and bunting and to make up a goody bag for each child. With a large number of children expected to attend, it was a mammoth task but teamwork ensured that all went smoothly and a goody bag was available for each child at the end of their session.

As the children arrived, they were greeted by an assortment of Lions in fancy dress, who were there

to make everyone feel welcome. Many of the children are regular attendees at the Lions Beach Party and recognised the characters from previous visits, often 'high-fiving' and shaking hands with them.

Radio Stoke were in attendance and chatted to Lions, school staff and carers and a number of children who were all delighted that they were going to be on the radio! DG Steve came along, plus Lions from Lichfield, Stafford, Hednesford and Vale Royal (sorry if we wore you all out guys but thanks for all your help on the day).



The changing rooms were full of excitement as school staff helped the children prepare for their time in the pool (usually a session of 1.5 hours). The pool area was a hive of activity and the decibel level was unbelievable! At the end of their session, the children returned to the changing rooms to dry off and get ready for the return to school. For those who were reluctant to leave, the goody bags proved a great incentive to get dry quickly and find that lost sock!

For many Zone G Lions, the day at WaterWorld is one of the highlights of the year. Zone Chair Lion Chris from Stone Lions Club commented "As Lions we do a lot of things that make us 'feel-good' and the day at WaterWorld is one of those events. Yes, it is costly and yes, we are all worn out at the end of the day but the smiles on the faces of the children make it all worthwhile! We are proud to say that we have never turned away a school; we feel that the experience for the children is extremely



worthwhile as a confidence builder, as well as being great fun, and provides them with the opportunity to use the facilities at a time when they are closed to the general public."

Each year the cost of staging the event increases and this year Lions were very fortunate to receive help from Staffordshire County Council, by way of a Community Grant made available by Councillors Jill Hood (Stone) and Jeremy Pert (Eccleshall), plus donations from Lions Clubs in South Staffordshire and Cheshire who all had schools from within their area attending on the day.

LIONS FEEL THE PAIN OF THE PANE

On hearing from the Mayor of Newport, Councillor Peter Scott, at our PSA Testing Event in the Cosy Hall in Newport in October, about the plight of the 1st Newport Scout Group, of the condition of their hut on Longford Road in Newport and what these youngsters were meeting under, made Gnosall & Newport Lions realise that they had to do something to help out.

The Hall, a prefabricated building of a certain age, was in an awful condition, leaking roof, no heating, and windows where some of the panes were either broken or taped up. We knew immediately we had to do something to help in supporting the mayor and his quest. Since that meeting the roof has been replaced but the building is still very cold and the windows are still in an awful condition. To say that these youngsters are hardy souls is an understatement, and as Rick Talbot, pointed out, "If adults had to work in these conditions then they would go on strike."



The Lions have recently donated £500 towards the cost of £4500 to replace the windows and, through the generosity of local organisations, the Scouts are on the way but still £2000 short of reaching their target. The Lions are therefore calling and challenging other organisations, or individuals to also support



these wonderful youngsters and their leaders giving them somewhere to be proud of, to meet in and carry out their work. This year alone, as this article is being written, the youngsters have been caving, climbing and working on badges and are working hard at becoming pillars of the community.
